I would like to thank Sis. Pressley and her entire staff for their efforts in



Pastor's Aid


Supporting the needs of our Pastor and developing special programs are the primary goals of the Pastor's Aid auxiliary.



FOR YOUR INFOR-MATION

Springtime is in the air the days are longer, the birds are singing, the baseball season is back and it is time to dust off the old barbecue grill. But before we get too excited about the opening of a new season we need to insure that we have completely closed the books on 1993 the tax books, that is, by April 15.

There were a number of changes in the federal tax codes for the filing of federal taxes for 1993. Fortunately or unfortunately, depending on your point of view, time will not permit me to go over them all, but I will talk about a few of the most common tax terms and try to explain how they affect your pocketbook.

First, starting with tax breaks, are the personal and dependent exemptions. Exemptions mean money that is exempted or not included as income in determining your tax liablility. Each person is

entitled one exemption unless they are claimed as a dependent in somebody else's federal incme tax return. You claim an exemption for yourself and your dependents.

Dependents being anyone you support financially. For 1993 each exemption is worth \$2,350.

Next are income tax deductions that are over and above the exemptions. There are two types of deductions. One is called "itemizing", that is, by listing one by one the different deductions, such as medical expenses, mortgage interest, donations to charities. property taxes and some miscellaneous expenses that can legally be deducted from income. The second is called the standard deductions, which is basically an average of what the IRS thinks most people spend on their "itemized" deductions. The standard deductions for 1993 are \$6,200 for a married couple and \$3,700 for a single tax payer. If you are 65 or older you get an additional deduction of \$900 if you are single and \$1,400 for a married couple. When you take a deduction, you subtract it from your income. Because you are in effect reducing your income you do not get a dollar for dollar reduction in the amount of tax you owe. For example, if you are in the 15 percent tax bracket a \$7,000 deduction would (Continue on next page)

reduce your taxes by \$1,050 (\$7,000 multiplied by .15 = \$1,050).

Our tax system is a progressive tax system. All that means is that the government does not tax all of our income at the same rate. As our income rises so does the amount of taxes that we owe on that income. For example, if you are single the first \$22,100 of income earned is taxed at 15 percent but income between \$22,101 and \$53,500 is taxed at 28 percent. For a married couple the first \$36,900 of income is taxed at 15 percent and income between \$36,901 and \$89,150 is taxed at 28 percent.

Lastly I would like to touch on tax credits Credits are dollar for dollar reductions to the tax you owe and are more valuable to you. You may claim the earned income credit if you have income of less than \$23,050 and have a dependent child. The credit for dependent care expenses can be claimed if you have income of \$10,000 or less and paid someone to care for a dependent child under 13. Credit for the elderly and permanently disabled is available if you are 65 or older or if you are retired and permanently and totally disabled.

I hope this short course in income taxes has been of some help, but please remember that I have had to simplify my examples

and you will need to check the tax code or with your tax advisor for your tax situation. We as Christians have a responsibility to support our government py paying our fair share of taxes. this means taking all legal tax deductions and credits that we are allowed to reduce our tax liability. We must be willing to "render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's" (Matthew 22:21).


